Unlike a maze with dead ends and false turns, labyrinth represents a journey to our own center and back again out into the world.

Labyrinths have long been used for meditation and reflection.

NEED IN COVINGTON



1. BRIDGING NEIGHBORHOODS

The Community Labyrinth Park will create a new public space to connect and bridge neighborhoods with the downtown district and the courthouse.

2. MORE GREEN SPACE

The labyrinth brings more green space to Covington, and increases social interaction in a safe, park-like setting.

3. PUBLIC ART

This park will provide a space for public and interactive art that further enhance engagement and experience.

4. HISTORY

This property has a history that needs to be told.

5. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The intent of the Community
Labyrinth Project is to provide a
centerpiece for community
gatherings and engagement, a
catalyst allowing healing and art
to converge, and a meditative
space for quietness and reflection.

6. PEDESTRIAN-FRIENDLY

The labyrinth walking path will be a functional, pedestrianfriendly space surrounded by benches, landscaping and public art.

7. GATHERING SPACE

Utilizing the ancient labyrinth as a centerpiece, this underutilized area will encourage resident engagement and civic and social life. It will be easily accessible by several neighborhoods.

8. ACCESSIBILITY

ADA compliant parking and access will make it pedestrian-friendly for all to enjoy.



This is a community park for adults and children of all ages.

Additionally, this ancient healing and centering tool can be useful for many segments of our community: the court system, schools, civic organizations, garden partnerships, Council on Aging, Youth Service Bureau, United Way Prosperity Center, Justice Center, Northshore Food Bank, St. Tammany Alliance for Mental Illness, Children's Advocacy Center: Hope House, Northshore Community Foundation, neighborhood churches and downtown office, restaurant and other workers.

The labyrinth's proximity to many of these organizations offers an opportunity for those experiencing stress a respite, aided by benches and the calming beauty that a well-landscaped, safe space can provide.



QUALITY OF LIFE

Approximately 10,000 labyrinths have been constructed world-wide in the last 25 years in a remarkable variety of locations. Many communities are recognizing the benefits a simple labyrinth provides.
